QUALIFICATIONS: A Ph.D. in accounting or PhD in a related area with education and/or experience in accounting is required. A PhD from an AACSB-accredited institution or similarly accredited international institution is required. ABD near completion will be considered. All technical fields will be considered, however, our greatest need is for individuals with interest in tax, auditing or international accounting. The person filling the position must be prepared to teach classes at both the graduate and undergraduate levels. Professional experience and certification are desired. Commitment to excellence in teaching and research is required.
